As we enter our sixth year, we continue to be guided by the inspiring evidence that exploratory, imaginative play in nature has the power to make childhood happier and healthier. Every child needs nature play, but for too many, regular access to outdoor play is out of reach. Our work to promote nature play equity through strong partnerships with schools and community non-profits has enabled us to give over 15,000 children memorable experiences in nature this year.

Thanks to the addition of three new staff members, we rolled out free day camp programs in ten city schoolyards over the summer. Our Nature and Discovery Center is now humming year round with day trippers, students on school field trips, campers, and volunteers.

More and more, we are taking our work on the road to offer keynote talks and classes. This year we spoke to over 1,400 teachers and therapists to prepare them to use nature play therapeutically to promote children's mental health. Addressing the loss of nature and play in childhood is a growing public health need. We are humbled by the opportunity to partner with so many wonderful people and organizations to uplift children through nature play. We thank you for your support.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Wildrock is in strong financial footing. Through a combination of fees-for-service revenue, grants, and private donations, we exceeded our financial goals in fiscal year 2022. Over the summer, we were able to offer scholarships to all campers in need. We also launched fourteen free nature-based programs in partnership with local schools and nonprofit organizations. Thanks to a grant from the American Recovery Act, we offered free Wildrock day camps at every elementary school in partnership with Charlottesville City Schools.

We have invested in three new staff members to prepare for future growth, as the need for outdoor programming is more and more recognized as a proven driver for healthy child development.



PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Wildrock regularly partners with schools to innovate nature-focussed projects with students. In the spring, Wildrock proposed that a trail be built adjacent to Agnor Hurt Elementary, the only county school still without forest access. Wildrock board members joined parents, students, and teachers to create a new woodland classroom.

To prepare for the launch the trail, Wildrock worked with fifth graders to introduce the woods to the school community through scavenger hunts, nature art, and maps. Over the summer, Wildrock provided daily recess nature enrichment programming for all the students attending summer school.


